

Guidelines for the Youth Concerts and Gifted Young People's Concerts

There are two informal **Youth Concerts NY** each year held in New York City, one on a Sunday in November or December, and one in late spring (look for all these events on the calendar you receive in the fall, and on the web site calendar: **www.leschetizky.org**). Each teacher may submit 2 students, aged up to 18, for these concerts. Preteens may play up to 5 minutes, students 13-15 up to 8 minutes, 16-18 up to 10 minutes. If the concert is not filled one week before the event, a third student may be included on the concert. There is a fee of \$30 for each student. Checks should be made out to The Leschetizky Association. Please contact **Debby Fortier** at **debby.fortier@gmail.com** or 917-412-6006 to enroll your students for the fall concert, **Delana Thomsen** at **dthomsen@msmnyc.edu**, for the spring concert.

For teachers who are active in New Jersey, the **Youth Concerts NJ** for gifted young pianists are held in Leshowitz Recital Hall at Montclair State University's John J. Cali School of Music, 1 Normal Ave, Upper Montclair, NJ. These concerts are held consecutively on a Sunday in early spring, one for each age group. There is a fee per student of \$30. Teachers should contact **Mark Pakma**n at 212-928-8590 or **pakmanm@mail.montclair.edu** to enroll their students.

- Preteens may perform up to 5 minutes total—up to three pieces or movements, omitting repeats if necessary.
- Teens may perform up to 8 minutes total—1 or 2 pieces or movements, with repeats omitted if necessary.
- Teachers may submit 3 students, with no more than 2 in one age category.

The adjudicated **Gifted Young People's Concerts** are held consecutively on a Sunday in February, one concert for each age group: Pre-teens (ages 5-12), Early Teens (ages 13-15), and Late Teens (ages 16-18).

Teachers may submit 3 students, with no more than 2 in one age category. The fee per student is \$30. Teachers are strongly advised to give their students the opportunity to perform in the Youth Concerts described above, as preparation for the Gifted Young People's Concerts. Teachers should mail their submissions to Alison Thomas, 880 West 181st Street, Apt. 3H, New York, NY, 10033, or send via email to alison.thomas@verizon.net.

- Please include the full title of each piece, with opus number, key, tempo markings for movements.
- Deadline for submitting students: two weeks before the concert date.
- Preteens may perform up to 5 minutes total, early teens up to 8 minutes, late teens up to 10 minutes.
- No adults may perform with students, and students must perform from memory, unless playing duets, or with prior permission of the director (special repertoire only will qualify for permission).
- Students must be properly dressed for a concert (no jeans, sneakers, etc.).

Please do not call the event chairman or the judges after the concerts. The decision of the judges is final. You will be notified promptly if your student has been selected to perform on the **Annual Awards Concert**, held at Tenri Cultural Institute, 43A West 13th Street, New York City, usually the following Sunday.

Only teachers who are members of the Leschetizky Association may present students at these events. Dues are \$50 per year. Lifetime memberships are for a limited time available for \$500, or you may choose the three years pay-in-advance option for \$135.
